Shaykh al-Albaanee's (رَحْمَةُ اللَّهِ)¹ daughters mentioning their father's answer to a question about Memorising the Qur'aan.

In their book, Hassaanah and Sukainah, the daughters of Shaykh al-Albaanee (رَحْمَةُ اللَّهِ) said, "And our father (رَحْمَةُ اللَّهِ), was asked, 'If I have memorised a quarter of the Qur'aan and then I move on to the second quarter [but] I haven't memorised the previous quarter properly, will I be sinful?' So he replied, 'You won't be sinful Inshaa'allaah, but you would not have responded appropriately to the Prophet's (صلى الله عليه وسلم)² saying, **"Keep refreshing your knowledge of the Qur'aan, for by the One in Whose Hand is the soul of Muhammad, it is more inclined to escape than a camel from its rope,"**³ In this hadeeth is an encouragement to refresh one's knowledge of the Qur'aan and to be persistent in reciting it, because it escapes from the breasts of men due to the loftiness of Allaah the Mighty and Majestic's Speech and its exaltedness."
